Clean Sweep!

Williams Park Neighbors are pleased to announce *Operation Clean Sweep*, scheduled for June 25 and 26. This is an opportunity to dispose of things we're no longer using in one of several different ways.

part one: On Saturday June 25, we'll hold a community yard sale with stations in Williams Park and throughout the neighborhood. Here we can clear out items by sale or donation. To sell our own things, we can set up a booth in the Park or sell in our own yard. If that's too much hassle or if you just feel generous, you can donate items to WPN: they'll be sold by neighborhood volunteers at the WPN booth in Williams Park. Proceeds from the sale of donated items will be used for a beautification project in the neighborhood

At 7:00 am, WPN volunteers will begin setting up in the Park and start selling as soon as the customers arrive. At 7:00 pm, they'll close down the booths and take any unsold items to a local charity.

This well-advertised and highly visible event should generate a good number of buyers. WPN will publish an ad in the Marietta Daily Journal, place flyers with local businesses, and post signs on the main neighborhood thoroughfares during the week before the sale.

part two: Sunday June 26 is our opportunity to get rid of the other stuff — the unsaleable, the unusable, the unwanted. The City of Smyrna has agreed to a free pick-up of those items during the following week. All we have to do is get them to the curb — and there's help with that too. Volunteers will assist in moving items to the curb on Sunday, June 26 between the hours of 12:00 and 4:00. If you need help call 770-431-9786 before June 23, and leave your number.

There are some limitations to the free pick-up. Excluded are tires, paint, chemicals, appliances containing refrigerant, extremely large items (such as hot tubs), and extremely large volume of construction debris. If you have questions about excluded items, call Smyrna's Public Works department at 770-431-2850.
